CHIEF TURNAROUND FINALISTS

- Dr. Eric Parker is currently the superintendent for Eastern Kentucky University's laboratory schools. As executive director for leadership and school improvement in Montgomery, Alabama, he led district turnaround efforts. He was principal of a high school and a middle school in Gwinnett County and of a high school in Atlanta.
